## **MTSS**

BRIDGE-RI is Rhode Island's official MTSS (Multi-Tiered System of Supports) model, aligned with state laws and regulations to promote a common language and framework statewide.

MTSS is a nationally recognized school improvement framework designed to meet the academic, behavioral, and social-emotional needs of all students. While its core features are consistent across the country, implementation can vary by state or context. Rooted in a commitment to high and equitable outcomes for every student, MTSS guides schools and districts in implementing:

- Evidence-based practices across all tiers of support
- Sustainable systems led by effective leadership



The Systems of Support Project, a group of five dedicated professionals, supports Rhode Island districts in implementing strong Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS). To advance this work, they developed BRIDGE-RI, a statewide platform designed to help schools and districts implement MTSS and evidence-based practices with fidelity. BRIDGE-RI provides resources and high-quality professional learning to strengthen collaboration, communication, and leadership, all in service of promoting equitable outcomes for all students.



# 03 MTSS RHODE ISLAND (MTSS-RI)

MTSS-RI is Rhode Island's version of a MTSS, customized to incorporate state regulations, statutes, and initiatives to support common language across RI. BRIDGE-RI is the tool used to support MTSS-RI.

#### **BRIDGE-RI**



BRIDGE-RI is the Moodle-powered learning management system (LMS) used by MTSS-RI to engage a variety of educational stakeholders in free online and blended learning professional learning. Learning opportunities through BRIDGE-RI are designed to increase knowledge and application of MTSS-related topics. Additionally, BRIDGE-RI is an approved provider of professional learning through RIDE's Professional Learning Resource Network. Those who complete courses on BRIDGE-RI are able to submit their certificates for Professional Learning Units (PLUs).

On BRIDGE-RI, educators can expect to learn about:

- Improving academic, behavioral, and/or social-emotional outcomes for students;
- Identifying and implementing evidence-based practices across the tiers of support, including universal core instruction and curriculum as well as targeted and intensive interventions;
- Building the capacity of leaders and teams to support educators;
- Using data to make decisions about core curriculum and instruction as well as intervention efficacy and movement into and out of interventions as needed.





## WHAT WE OFFER

BRIDGE-RI offers professional learning courses at **no cost**. To enroll in online professional learning, a user must create an account with BRIDGE-RI. It's free and easy to do.

Professional learning through BRIDGE-RI is centered around one consistent framework - MTSS.

- Any practices shared are evidence-based.
- The use of data to guide decision-making is explicitly outlined for each tier of support.
- Participants earn certificates of completion and PLUs for completed courses.

**Self-paced** courses are short (1-2 hours), asynchronous and available anytime. While designed for individual completion, best practice encourages educators to engage in collaborative learning (e.g., in PLCs) to support implementation and align with school improvement goals.


**Facilitated** courses are longer and held over a period of time, e.g., September-December 2024. Participants will engage in both asynchronous coursework as well as synchronous checkins with course facilitators. There are typically assignments and deadlines with set dates for enrollment.

**Communities of Practice** are opportunities for participants to come together in real time to learn together, problem solve, and collaborate on a particular topic (or topics).
